



Our families live all over Rhode Island and Massachusetts. Transportation options are as various as our students. For any kind of transportation, remember that School One begins at 8:50 a.m. and classes are over at 3:00 p.m. Students can arrive any time after 8 a.m. and the building remains open until 4:30 p.m.

School buses: The state of Rhode Island will provide school bus transportation to School One if you live in one of the following districts: Barrington, Bristol, Central Falls, Cranston, East Providence, Johnston, Lincoln, North Providence, Pawtucket, Smithfield, Warren. If you live in one of these districts and would like to request a school bus, please fill out the online form at <http://ride.ri.gov/StudentsFamilies/AdditionalResources/StudentTransportation.aspx> Parents and guardians can also email transinfo@ride.ri.gov or call at 222-5024 with questions. If you live in Lincoln please call the school and we will send you information on registration and bus stops in your town.

If you live in Providence, 2 miles or more from School One, the district will provide a monthly RIPTA bus pass but will not provide school bus transportation. Families need to request a form from Alayne Todd, School One's Office Manager or email Peggy.Grullon@ppsd.org to request the form. Each month, Alayne picks up the passes from Providence Public Schools and distributes them to the designated students.

If your student has an Individual Education Plan and your local school district funds School One's tuition, then the district is legally required to provide school bus transportation regardless of where you live. To request a school bus, please call the special education administrator in your school district.

Public Transportation: Many students use the RIPTA system to take public transportation to School One. RIPTA Bus 40 leaves and arrives within a few blocks from School One. Bus 35 will pick up and drop off near Wayland Square. For more information about bus routes, go to <http://www.ripta.com/> and visit the trip planner.

School Pool: School One participates in School Pool, an online service that facilitates ride-sharing between School One and other nearby schools such as Wheeler and Lincoln School. Parents can click the link on School One's website (<http://www.school-one.org/ApplytoS1/HowtoApply/tabid/189/Default.aspx>) and sign up with School Pool. School Pool verifies that the student is enrolled at School One.

Informal car pools: We are happy to try to connect you with any families who live in your neighborhood to discuss possible car pools or coordination.

Other: Some students ride bikes, walk, or have parents drop them off and pick them up. Some of our older students drive themselves to and from school. Students who drive can give other students a ride to or from school, but cannot transport other students in their cars during the day.
